



Hand tools and planing workshop with Scott Wynn

Please review the “what to bring” tool and supplies lists below. You are expected to bring a minimum compliment of hand tools and sharpening supplies. Allow extra time for mail order purchases. TIP: For new hand tool conditioning, it is extremely helpful to have taken the WWA Sharpening class prior to this one. Remember—The main emphasis of this class is using conditioned tools for woodworking. There is limited time, of about 2 hours, for conditioning new and used planes and chisels. Each tool can take up to several hours to prepare for use. Many use the Sharpening class to prepare their chisels and plane blades which frees time for plane body conditioning in this class.

Special Note: It is permissible to attend this class without bringing tools, and/or without participating in the hands on opportunities, but the purpose of this course is for folks to be assisted by an expert to improve their hand tool skills. The WWA has several types of required tools for sharing, but cannot guarantee access to them when you need them. You will have to wait for these, if you don't bring your own.

All of the tools and sharpening supplies listed are good quality and should serve you well for many years. Entry level WWers might consider acquiring the least expensive options while others might buy the very best (and unfortunately most expensive) options. All listed prices are subject to change.

REQUIRED HAND TOOLS: For cutting a through mortise and tenon and making a bench hook.

- Minimum- 1 ea. ½”, ¾”, 1” or 1 ½” bench chisels. Consider buying a set of 4-6ea Marples chisels from Woodworkers Supply, Inc. 800-645-9292 WWW.woodworker.com \$33-\$59 or Woodcraft 800-225-1153 WWW.woodcraft.com
- 1 ea. Ryoba saw Japan WW part #19.611.0 \$30.95 WWW.japanwoodworker.com, or a back or bow saw, or rip and cross cut Japanese saws.
- 1 ea. square or 4-6" combination square, ruler, pencil and a mallet or hammer.
- Options- 1 ea. ½” mortise chisel JWW parts #14.301.12 \$49.30, Sashi Gane (like a framing square in English) #15.632.1 \$27.25, mortise marking gauge and/or single blade or disk marking gauge Veritas wheel gauge #27.053.310 \$31.60 or much better Mark Tite#58.001. \$79, scratch awl, scribe or marking knife, bevel gauge, Azibiki saw #15.121.90 \$25.15, hand planes. If you own planes, please call to clarify which ones to bring.

REQUIRED SHARPENING SUPPLIES: All part numbers below-Japan Woodworker catalog.

- Minimum- Please bring you own water stone bin or bucket and rags. Entry level folks should consider buying a combination coarse/polish water stone 1000/6000 #01.096.30 \$44.65 or 1200/8000 #01.091.30 \$62.95 and a Nagura stone #15.576.47 \$8.75.
- Options- Instead of a combination stone, try a Bester 1200 ceramic stone #02.097.12 \$43.50 and a North Mountain Super Polish Stone #01.099.10 \$69.25 which includes a Nagura stone. The Takenoko 8000 #04.098.50 \$62.40 cuts faster and could precede the Mountain Stone. The DMT coarse/extra coarse diamond plate # 45.018.4 \$99.75 is best for rough, fast honing. Any diamond or lapping plate can be used to deglaze and flatten water stones.
